Rochester, N.Y. Nov. 22, 1892

My dear friend,

I went directly through to Syracuse – found my sister Mary at the station – ready to join me – so she came with my sleeper -- & we chatted all the way to Syracuse – we had a splendid meeting there of the very best people -- & many of them – Tell your dear mother – I received her note – telling of her mailing the envelope to Miss Willard & Lady Henry -- & tell her I am very much obliged – for I was very vexed with myself for forgetting to do it -- I left it there
