Sept. 3, 1901 -

Dear Anna E. (Dann)

Your two letters - Aug. 31 - & Sept. 2, are here, - the letters of this P. M. mail - I was asleep when Charlotte brought down your family letter - & read it to sister Mary - I had a mind to go directly up to Miss Heaths & see it - but I thought she would have it directed & sent to Mr. Mason - who is at home - taking his vacation - but Miss Heath promised that I shall have it when - he - Mr. Mason returns.

I am glad Mrs. Harper is going to be at Buffalo. Mrs. Cook is in the Adirondacks - enjoying herself hugely - she writes sister Mary - Margarets Mother is visiting at her aunts - She spent one afternoon to tea - here - when Mary & I were over to view Anna O's. - Perhaps she will come & stay nights with her while we are gone - You have got through four weeks of the time - am glad Mrs. Harpers brother can visit her while you are there to fix up things nice for him -- It was nice that Mrs. Harper invited you to go along with them - Sister Mary & Margaret put up 13 bottles of tomatoes the other day they are beautiful - peaches are just coming now - we have had them from the south - all along - but they are not very good yet - very soon - they look nice to day - about the 13th am at their height - Sister Mary will can a lot just as soon as they get at the right time - they are 75 cts a basket now -- Margaret, her Uncle & Mother & brother - went to Buffalo yesterday - went 7.15 A. M. & got back at 11 P. M. - She is tired enough to day - didn't wash to day - Mrs. Sweet & her Mother have just come - to tea -- I had a half dozen beautiful tea plates - & one large bread plate - they are decorated beautifully -- They were sent me by Mrs. White - from Oil City - to whom I presented a set of the history - you'll enjoy serving up salad - or something on them - when you get back!

Wednesday P. M. This morning I went with Sister Mary & Cousin Jessie Anthony down to the City Hall to the Meeting of the Auxilliary of the Standard Engineers Association - Mrs. Montgomery made the address and I then addressed them - a half hour I think - then we came out at 2 P.M. went to Fitzhugh Hall & drove down to Highland Park - back through East avenue then down State to Platt & across the bridge - & had a look at the Upper Falls - then down on St. Paul Street and across the Seneca Bridge & viewed the Lower Falls then back home - The Engineers gave the attending ladies the treat -

they got 28 baskets of peaches - and a whole butter pail full of candies - besides boxes & boxes of candy - then Dunn & Co. - gave a nice little package of chewing gum & Sen Sen to every one - think of us - accepting a present of chewing gum - To night they have a dance in the Mirror Hall - in Powers Block - and tomorrow they have meeting & entertainment all day - so much for the engineers - Anna Shaw is coming tomorrow - & I have promised her to make a speech - if the men & women will all meet together - which they say they will -- Tues mornng-- Then Saturday morning at 8.30 we go to Buffalo - all hands of us - Saturday P. M. at 1.20 take train to East Aurora - and then the meetings in Buffalo all the week --

Meantime - I think the peaches are coming on with such a rush we will have do a big job of canning of them - before we go to Buffalo - Did Mary tell you she wanted Mrs. Harpers receipt for that pickle you made of tomatoes - - but I think they wont have to be packed until you get here - We found your Post Card - glad enough you are going to Floraderas - it is so good of Mr. Husted to bring your ticket - you had better offer to pay him back - perhaps he wont take it - but you should offer it - It is a great thing that Mrs. Harper & he invited you in their circle - I am gladder than I can tell that they do - - You must be awful kind & obliging to them -

I cant see to write more & dont know as you can read this.

Shall be very glad to see Mrs. Harper - Genevieve isn't able to call for her letters - but she is able to go down town - She is out of the hospital now - Mary takes Mrs. Harpers Post Card to her now - -
